Miniature Zebu Cattle Project

There is an adult interested in leading a miniature zebu cattle project in the county. Below is a little information on the breed. She would first like to know if there is an interest from members to learn more about these cattle. If you are interested in becoming a part of this project, please contact the 4-H Office, 763-8015. Primary members are not eligible for this project.

Miniature Zebus are a very old breed of miniature cattle, possibly dating back to 3000 B.C. Generally, they do not exceed 42 inches, and they weigh less than 600 pounds. They have a large hump on their back. They come in shades of gray, white, black and chestnut. Miniature Zebus have horns which are set high and point up or back. Their ears are not lop, like Brahma cattle. They live about 20 to 25 years. They eat hay and grain. There are two registries in the USA for Miniature Zebus: International Miniature Zebu Association (IMZA) and American Miniature Zebu Association (AMZA). The 2006-2007 California 4-H State Ambassador Team would like to invite you to attend the 2007 State 4-H Leadership Conference being held August 2-5 at UC Davis. This four-day leadership conference is open to high school-aged 4-Her's and is an excellent opportunity to meet fellow 4-H members from across the state.

The conference will feature keynote speakers, educational tracks and workshops and lots of

fun! This year's keynote speakers include teacher, counselor, author and speaker Toody Byrd, self-help guru Josh Shipp, and continuing a tradition started at last year's conference, the 4-H State Ambassador Team. Tracks and workshops will range in topics from digital video editing and team building activities, to animal science and leadership skills. Evening events will include a relaxing night of games and team building activities on the first night and a luau Friday night in the biggest free form pool west of the Mississippi. During the luau there will be the annual sectional volleyball tournament as well as movie and board games in the pool side lounge. On the final night of the conference there will be a formal dance under the stars to wrap things up.

Registration is due to your county 4-H office by June 22, 2007.

The sooner registration forms are turned in, the better your chances are of getting the tracks and workshops you want. The registration fee of \$380 covers food in the all-you-can-eat, top-of-the-line UCD Segundo Dining Commons and a four night stay in the high-rise Segundo Residence Halls. 2007 Golden Clover Awards

The Golden Clover Awards recognize outstanding achievement of 4-H members, volunteers, and groups within the 4-H Youth Development Program. 4-H Members, 4-H Volunteers, and 4-H Groups may be nominated or self-nominated in any applicable categories. Individuals and groups may only win once in a category every three years.

Applications must contain the Cover Page, Essay Questions and optional components of letters of recommendation and other additional materials including photographs, clippings, videos, flyers, and stories. Each category will be awarded \$500 to be used at the discretion of the award winner(s). Also awarded are a medallion, pin, and recognition on the 4-H website. Winners will be announced at the 4-H State Leadership Conference and State 4-H Leaders' Forum. Applications are awarded in 11 member categories, 11 volunteer categories and 8 group categories. Volunteer Awards in memory of Keith Barnes are sponsored by the California Farm Bureau Federation.
