County Record Books Due

Record Books are due in the County Office by **May 17, 2007**. Now is the time for all members to be working to get their books up to date and ready for judging at the club level in time to meet their clubs due date. All books that have received a gold seal from their club are eligible to be entered in the county-wide judging.

What is a Record Book?

It is a written report of your 4-H participation and accomplishments. You record the things you did as well as the things you learned in 4-H.

Why Do We Do Them?

The main reason is to be recognized for your accomplishments and to document what you have learned in the 4-H Program. In addition, members can earn Star Rank Awards to display on their hats. Through the process of putting together a record book, however, you also learn many valuable life skills which will benefit you in your school work and throughout your life.

How Do I Learn How To Do A Record Book Correctly?

The forms and the instructions are available from the 4-H Office. Club and project leaders and older teens in your club may be able to give you information and assistance. There is more information available on-line and there may be trainings available through your club. The very best way to do a record book is to just get started! Do the best you can, learn from that and improve each year.

Are There Different Requirements for Different Ages?

Yes

Primary Members (ages 5-8) use an abbreviated record book format made especially for them.

<u>Junior Members</u> (ages 9-13) and <u>Senior Members</u> (ages 14-18) use the PDR (Personal Development Report) format which has clear and easy to follow instructions.

Is It Too Late to Do a Record Book if I've Never Done One?

Absolutely not! You will need to reconstruct your records for past years with the help of your leaders, parents, and other members. The important thing is to start and do the best you can. You will never regret the work you put into this process as it will benefit you greatly as you continue in 4-H, school, and life.

Financial Aid Applications for State Leadership Conference

The Wells Fargo Foundation, through a gift secured by The California 4-H Foundation, has generously provided funds which will allow youth to attend the 2007 4-H State Leadership Conference.

Financial assistance will be allotted on an "as needed and available" basis and is not transferable. Delegates may ask for up to \$330 of financial aid. Financial aid selections will be based on:

- Income of the family and family size
- Contribution to the diversity of the 4-H State Leadership Conference (e.g. participation in different delivery modes, those requiring special needs, etc.)
- Extenuating circumstances such as the death of a parent, parental unemployment, etc.
- Preference to those not having received financial aid previously
- Those demonstrating an active interest in developing and utilizing skills learned after the conference
- Expected transportation costs to the campus hosting the conference based on geographic distance

Upon returning from the conference, all youth receiving financial aid must complete the following:

- Write a letter of thanks to the Wells Fargo Foundation.
- Include a brief summary describing how the conference experience impacted the delegate and what actions were taken after the conference.

Each category will be awarded \$500 to be used at the discretion of the award winner(s). Also awarded are a medallion, pin, and recognition on the 4-H website. Winners will be announced at the 4-H State Leadership Conference and State 4-H Leaders' Forum. Applications are awarded in 11 member categories, 11 volunteer categories and 8 group categories. Volunteer Awards in memory of Keith Barnes are sponsored by the California Farm Bureau Federation.

2007 State 4-H Record Books

Books eligible for State judging must meet the following criteria:

- * 4-H member is at least 14 years of age by December 31, 2007 and no older than 19 years old by December 31, 2007.
- * 4-H member was enrolled in the 4-H Youth Development Program during the entire program year for which the 4-H Record Book is being submitted.
- Folder: Label on upper right-hand corner of front cover: 1) Name, 2) County, 3) Address.
- * Correct formatting: handwritten or 12 point font typewritten in Garamond, Arial, Times New Roman or Helvetica in black ink.
 - 1 ½" inside (left) margin.
 - Page limitations not exceeded.
 - No plastic page covers.
- * State 4-H Judging Cover Page completed and with proper signatures
- * Personal Development Report completed and with proper signatures
- My 4-H Story written and no more than 6 pages, single-sided included.
- * Projects:
 - An Annual Project Report Form for each project completed
 - A Junior/Teen Leadership Report for each Junior/Teen Leadership reported
 - · County Supplemental forms removed
- Collection of 4-H Work
 - No more than 11 page total, including: No more than 2 pages of Newspaper clippings (single-sided), 2 pages of letters (single-sided), 2 pages of flyers/brochures and 5 pages of photographs (single-sided)
- Previous Years' Materials removed.
- * Three summary pages included:
